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1.0 Introduction

- 1.8 It is the responsibility of the individual to bring to the attention of the Committee any known medical condition or previous injuries that may affect their or other Club member's safe participation within the sport. If the issue is of a sensitive nature, then this MUST be raised with the Sports Federation.

If this does not prove satisfactory a written complaint should be made to the Sports Federation President. The matter will be considered at the next available OUSF Executive Committee Meeting.
